This Uniform Crime Report reflects data reported by the City of Suwanee to the State of Georgia for the entire year of 2004. These statistics are forwarded to the federal government and are included in the FBI crime statistic reports. The collection of Uniform Crime Reports is a federal program in which all police agencies are required to participate.

This data is collected only for crimes considered to be the most serious. "Total cleared" refers to the number of stated offenses that either were able to be resolved by arrest of the offender or exceptionally cleared. "Exceptionally cleared" means that the investigation has definitely established the identity of the offender, and there is sufficient information to support their arrest and that the defendant's location is known, but there is some reason outside law enforcement control that precludes this arrest. Examples would include death of the offender or lack of cooperation on the part of the victim to prosecute.
